Program Format Overview

The SEALS 2018 Annual Meeting brochure reflects the contributions of committees, resource teams, and individuals in proposing panel topics, securing speakers, moderators, mentors, and writing panel descriptions.

The SEALS 2018 Annual Meeting program includes a variety of program formats. The paragraphs below provide a brief description of each format. Unless otherwise indicated, every program is open to all SEALS attendees.

New Scholars Workshop

The New Scholars Workshop offers newer faculty members an opportunity to present, and receive feedback on, a work in progress. Over the course of the annual meeting, there will be six New Scholars Workshop sessions, each typically featuring a moderator and three or four speakers. Speakers are nominated by member schools, and each speaker is assigned a mentor, who is available to provide both pre-and post-presentation advice and commentary. Whenever possible, SEALS groups New Scholars Workshop panels thematically.

Prospective Law Teachers and Newer Law Teachers Workshops

In 2013, SEALS introduced two new features that built upon the success of its New Scholars Workshop. Given the features' success, SEALS is continuing them. The first is the Prospective Law Teachers Workshop (planned by the committee of the same name), which is aimed at assisting VAPs, Fellows, LLMs, and others interested in obtaining an entry-level academic position. This Workshop includes mock interviews, CV reviews, and various informational sessions to help attendees navigate the hiring market. The second is the Newer Law Teachers Workshop (planned by the Beginning and Newer Law Teachers Committee). These Workshops focus on issues that are of particular interest to newer law teachers, such as becoming a good classroom teacher, creating an effective course, methods of assessment, becoming a good scholar, and balancing service and scholarship.

Topical Workshops

Each year, SEALS offers interrelated events under a Workshop designation. Topics vary from year to year. Each Workshop has several events, which usually are scheduled for a single day but sometimes extend into a second day. When possible, Workshop sessions are scheduled to follow the same break schedule as other programs, so that attendees with multiple interests can attend a topical Workshop session in one time slot and a different topical Workshop (or some other event) in another time slot in the same day.

Discussion Groups

Participants in these events will focus on a particular topic or theme, as identified in the program. Although Discussion Groups are convened in different ways, in many cases, the participants prepare a short paper in advance of the annual meeting that the other participants read and comment upon at the session. These sessions are often longer than a traditional panel session to allow for a more in-depth, interactive discussion of the topic or theme. Discussion Groups may, but need not be, linked to Workshop programs. Those who convene Discussion Groups are encouraged to include participants selected from a call for papers to the SEALS membership. The program description for each session offers additional information about the composition of the event and the way in which the session will be conducted.

Panels

SEALS offers many "standalone" panels organized around a specific topic or theme. Topics and themes may be theoretical, doctrinal, pedagogical, service-oriented, law reform-oriented, or focused on other matters of interest to law school faculty members and administrators. Panels are moderated and typically consist of up to five featured speakers. In most cases, presenters are not required to submit or bring written drafts or copies of their related work.

Luncheons

The Call for Papers Luncheon features the work of faculty members whose papers were selected from among those submitted for review. This luncheon is ticketed and requires advance reservations. Please consider attending the Call for Papers lunch to support the winning scholars, but be sure to purchase your ticket in advance.

The New Scholars Luncheon, sponsored by Wolters Kluwer, offers a networking opportunity for newer faculty members. Those participating in the New Scholars Workshop and the Prospective Law Teachers Workshop are invited to attend but must purchase a ticket in advance.

The Steering Committee Luncheon is the meeting at which officers and committee chairs report on SEALS activities. It is also the forum at which institutional member schools elect new SEALS officers and other trustees. Each institutional and affiliate member school selects one individual to represent it at this luncheon (in addition to any faculty member who is already a trustee or committee chair).

The University of Kentucky College of Law, the University of West Virginia College of Law and the Elon University School of Law will sponsor a luncheon for all law school deans attending the conference.

West Academic is also sponsoring a luncheon that is open to all attendees. This year's luncheon focuses on features of CasebookPlusTM. In addition Lexis Nexis is sponsoring a Writing Connections Workshop Luncheon as part of the Legal Writing Workshop.

Breaks and Receptions

Breaks between sessions (which are sponsored by Carolina Academic Press, Edward Elgar Publishing, the National Institute for Trial Advocacy, SEATGEN, West Academic, and Wolters Kluwer) and receptions (sponsored by American University, Washington College of Law, Carolina Academic Press, Nova Southeastern University Shepard Broad Law Center, the Federalist Society, and West Academic) provide opportunities to interact with colleagues at other schools who share your teaching or scholarly interests and with representatives from publishers. Depending on the type and timing of the event, beverages or food may be available. A reception hosted by three of our newest members (Benjamin E. Cardozo School of Law, Yeshiva University; Wayne State University Law School; and Drexel University, Thomas R. Kline School of Law) introduces those schools to SEALS.

Today's law students should be proficient with technologies currently used in legal practice, including cloud computing, eDiscovery, presentation, and information security applications. And there are emerging applied technologies such as cryptocurrencies, blockchain, 3D printing, and wearable technology with vast potential to be disruptive to future legal practice modalities. Law schools must produce graduates prepared to engage with these technologies. What is the role of the law library in educating future lawyers about emerging technologies? This discussion group explores controversial remedies in private and public law. Remedies in the headlines include nationwide injunctions against executive orders, global injunctions to protect intellectual property, expansive contempt orders, equitable remedies for the European right to be forgotten, criminal "restitution" to compensate victims, remedies for intangible harms such as data breaches, and civil restitution to disgorge unjust gains from opportunistic breaches of contract. Some discussants offer comparative approaches and historic examples to glean ideal paths for modern controversial remedies. We also examine the theoretical underpinnings that propel controversial remedies, underlying substantive areas, and defenses. Finally, we suggest reforms and limits to shape the law of remedies in ways that best serve the goals of the rights at stake.

1:00 PM - WORKSHOP ON MUNICIPAL DEBT 2:45 PM Restructuring Puerto Rico's Debt: Implications for the Territory and Beyond

This panel addresses many of the issues that have arisen in connection with Puerto Rico's debt crisis, and the impact of these issues on other government fiscal crises, including treatment of municipal, sovereign, and territorial debt. Participants will discuss issues such as the enforceability of "bankruptcy remote" municipal debt issuances; reduced federal healthcare funding in Puerto Rico and possible comparisons to Medicaid reform elsewhere in the United States; government responses to crises, including domestic austerity measures; the extent to which Puerto Rico's distress (and the responses to it) will impact access to capital markets for other U.S. territories; and the effects of the creation of PROMESA, the legislative response to Puerto Rico's distress.

Nationally, law schools are grappling with the new guidelines and vary in how to interpret the requirements and guidance memo. This discussion delves into the current standards and includes a foreshadowing of new proposed guidelines of 303 and 304 to build context where ambiguity appears in the standards.

This panel explores intellectual property and related legal regimes such as art law that bear on the creative arts and industries. The panelists address a wide range of doctrinal and empirical issues, including markets for creativity, user-generated content and nontraditional expressive forms—including those popularized by the rise of the Internet—and legal doctrines aimed at preserving a robust public domain.

The limits of Klein's "rule of decision" holding became an issue in the recent Bank Markazi and Patchak cases. Meanwhile, lower courts continue to wrestle with the equal protection "class of one doctrine" the Supreme Court validated in in 2000. Finally, Congress and the President have engaged in singling out any constitutional principle requiring that government action be generally applicable. These phenomena raise questions whether the principles that underlay Klein restrict such hyper-specific government action. In addition, investment in blockchain technology has surged over the past year, inviting both legitimate businesses and modern-day scammers. To date, regulatory agencies have yet to determine a consistent approach to the technology that protects the public while not stifling innovation. This session addresses some of the myriad issues that the technology faces and provides insights on how best to address those issues.

Since the Supreme Court decided Salman v. United States in 2016, there has been much uncertainty surrounding the rigor of the "personal benefit" test for tipper-tippee insider trading liability. The water was muddled still further when on August 23, 2017, a split panel of the Second Circuit decided United States v. Martoma, interpreting Salman as holding that a gift of material nonpublic information can personally benefit a tipper even if there is no "meaningfully close personal relationship" between the tipper and tippee. Martoma offers yet another example of a U.S. insider trading regime that is in flux. This discussion group addresses the implications of Martoma, as well as other U.S. insider trading enforcement themes.

Chief Justice Roberts famously indicated the 2015 discovery rule amendments were a "big deal," designed "to address the most serious impediments to just, speedy, and efficient resolution of civil disputes."
