

### **Program Format Overview**

The SEALS 2017 Annual Meeting brochure reflects the contributions of committees, resource teams, and individuals in proposing panel topics, securing speakers, moderators, mentors, and writing panel descriptions.

The SEALS 2017 Annual Meeting program includes a variety of program formats. The paragraphs below provide a brief description of each format. Unless otherwise indicated, every program is open to all SEALS attendees.

#### **New Scholars Workshop**

The New Scholars Workshop offers newer faculty members an opportunity to present, and receive feedback on, a work in progress. Over the course of the annual meeting, there will be eleven New Scholars Workshop sessions, each typically featuring a moderators and three or four speakers. speakers are nominated by member schools, and each speaker is assigned a mentor, who is available to provide both pre-and post-presentation advice and commentary. Whenever possible, SEALS groups New Scholars Workshop panels thematically.

#### Prospective Law Teachers and Newer Law Teachers Workshops

In 2013, SEALS introduced two new features that built upon the success of its New Scholars Workshop. Given the features' success, SEALS is continuing them. The first is the Prospective Law Teachers Workshop (planned by the committee of the same name), which is aimed at assisting VAPs, Fellows, LLMs, and others interested in obtaining an entry-level academic position. This Workshop includes mock interviews, CV reviews, and various informational sessions to help attendees navigate the hiring market. The second new feature is the Newer Law Teachers Workshop (planned by the Beginning and Newer Law Teachers Committee). These Workshops focus on issues that are of particular interest to the newer law teachers, such as becoming a good classroom teacher, creating an effective course, methods of assessment, becoming a good scholar, and balancing service and scholarship.

#### **Topical Workshops**

Each year, SEALS offers interrelated events under a Workshop designation. Topics vary from year to year. Each Workshop has several events, which usually are scheduled for a single day but sometimes extend into a second day. When possible, Workshop sessions are scheduled to follow the same break schedule as other programs, so that attendees with multiple interests can attend a topical Workshop session in one time slot and a different topical Workshop (or some other event) in another time slot in the same day.

#### Discussion Groups

Participants in these events will focus on a particular topic or theme, as identified in the program. Although Discussion Groups are convened in different ways, in many cases, the participants prepare a short paper in advance of the annual meeting that the other participants read and comment upon at the session. These sessions are often longer than a traditional panel session to allow for a more in-depth, interactive discussion of the topic or theme. Discussion Groups may, but need not be, linked to Workshop programs. Those who convene Discussion Groups are encouraged to include participants selected from a call for papers to the SEALS membership. The program description for each session offers additional information about the composition of the event and the way in which the session will be conducted.

#### **Panels**

SEALS offers many "standalone" panels organized around a specific topic or theme. Topics and themes may be theoretical, doctrinal, pedagogical, service-oriented, law reform-oriented, or focused on other matters of interest to law school faculty members and administrators. Panels are moderated and typically consist of up to five featured speakers. In most cases, presenters are not required to submit or bring written drafts or copies of their related work.

#### Luncheons

The Call for Papers Luncheon features the work of faculty members whose papers were selected from among those submitted for review. This luncheon is ticketed and requires advance reservations. Please consider attending the Call for Papers lunch to support the winning scholars, but be sure to purchase your ticket in advance.

The New Scholars Luncheon, sponsored by Wolters Kluwer, offers a networking opportunity for newer faculty members. It is not limited to those who present at the New Scholars Workshop, but it does require advance reservations.

The Steering Committee Luncheon is the meeting at which officers and committee chairs report on SEALS activities. It is also the forum at which institutional member schools elect new SEALS officers and other trustees. Each institutional and affiliate member school selects one individual to represent it at this luncheon (in addition to any faculty member who is already a trustee or committee chair).

West Academic is also sponsoring a luncheon that is open to all attendees.

#### **Breaks and Receptions**

Breaks between sessions (which are sponsored by Carolina Academic Press, Edward Elgar Publishing, Thomson Reuters, West Academic, and Wolters Kluwer) and receptions (sponsored by West Academic and the Federalist Society) provide opportunities to interact with colleagues at other schools who share your teaching or scholarly interests and with representatives from publishers. Depending on the type and timing of the event, beverages or food may be available. Receptions hosted by our newest members (The University of the Pacific, McGeorge School of Law, and the Loyola University Chicago School of Law) introduce those schools to SEALS. The New Scholars Luncheon (sponsored by Wolters Kluwer), and the Call for Papers Luncheon are ticketed and require advance reservations; the other events do not.

#### Discussion Group: Religious Exemptions and Harm to Others

The U.S. Supreme Court has held that the First Amendment sometimes allows, sometimes requires, and sometimes forbids religious exemptions from neutral and generally applicable laws. In recent years, scholars have focused on the issue of whether religious exemptions improperly impose harms on third parties. They have asked whether there is (or should be) a principle prohibiting religious exemptions that burden third parties, whether that principle has constitutional roots, where that principle might be located within legal doctrine, and how that principle might be applied. This discussion group brings together scholars with different answers to those questions to explore the various issues and advance the academic debate.

# 10:00 AM - WORKSHOP ON PROPERTY 12:00 PM Discussion Group: Property at SCOTUS

During the Fall 2016 term, the U.S. Supreme Court took on several property related cases. *Murr v. Wisconsin* presented a takings challenge to conventional zoning rights in the face of potential vested rights and the relevant parcel question. Fair housing reemerged in two consolidated cases before the court -- *Bank of America v. Miami* and *Wells Fargo & Co. v. Miami*. And *Venezuela v. Helmerich & Payne International* sought to clarify when a foreign government may be sued in U.S. courts for seizing property located in that country but owned by a U.S. firm. Property scholars discuss the impact of these decisions on property jurisprudence, theory, and function.

#### 2:45 PM Discussion Group: Property, Retroactivity, and Obergefell

In the first decision of its kind, a judge in Bucks County Pennsylvania allowed retroactive recognition of a same-sex common-law marriage. Dr. Sabrina Mauer and Dr. Kimberly Underwood, a gay couple were married in the early 1990s. In 2015, they married under the now sanctioned state processes and three months later, one spouse died. The court held that the marriage dated back to the 1990s, which had a number of impacts for the surviving spouse's Social Security rights and other property rights. Other courts have differed or struggled to come to similar conclusions. This discussion group will consider the retroactivity of Obergefell and how that can impact property rights — be they inheritance, marital/community property, etc.

# 1:00 PM - WORKSHOP ON ALTERNATIVE DISPUTE RESOLUTION 2:45 PM Utilizing ADR Competitions to Foster Practical Dispute Resolution Skills

Given that so few cases actually go to trial, it is critical that lawyers know how to negotiate effectively to resolve disputes. Through alternative dispute resolution (ADR) competitions, law schools can provide students with opportunities to develop their negotiation skills. This panel explores why participation in ADR competitions is beneficial for students and how the skills learned have direct application to practice. Panelists review specific strategies for implementing a successful ADR competition program. How should students be selected and trained? What are the benefits of tying participation to academic credit? How can this be done within the constraints of shrinking budgets? Panelists identity various ADR competition opportunities, internal tryout processes, coaching, scheduling, budget constraints, academic credit, and more.

#### 2:45 PM Updates on Public Health Law and Emergency Preparedness

This panel explores the latest developments in and challenges to our public health system with respect to emergency preparedness. The panel begins with a discussion of Zika as a case study for persistent shortcomings in our nation's public health readiness, particularly with respect to delays in legislative response. The panel transitions to the impact of these broad failings in two contexts: hospitals (and the consequent reimbursement issues faced by hospitals in the face of emergencies) and rural communities (and how federal and state systems fail to adapt emergency preparedness to address particular rural populations' needs). The panel ends with clear proposals for how to improve public health readiness and address special needs for hospitals and vulnerable populations.

#### 1:00 PM - WORKSHOP ON TEACHING 2:45 PM Teaching through Injustice

Since Michael Brown's death in 2014, our students have been inundated with reports of incidents between police officers and African-American men, women and children. Many of these confrontations have resulted in death, physical harm, psychological harm, and protests, as well as federal investigations. Some have resulted in criminal charges against officers, while others have not. These incidents have raised more questions than answers. This is particularly true for our students, who are learning about law and legal institutions with these incidents as context. As a result, many students are questioning and struggling with the very meaning of justice as well as their role(s) in various legal systems. This panel addresses the challenges of teaching students who are losing faith in justice.

A central aspect of President Trump's campaign platform was to repeal and replace the Affordable Care Act. This discussion group analyzes the tensions of equity. We examine the presence of equity concepts in remedies, underlying substantive areas, and defenses. The concept of equity has legal and lay meanings. Negatively, equity means unbridled discretion; positively, fairness. Functionalism promotes less emphasis on equity, but historical roots are strong. Equity lives after the merger of law and equity. The U.S. Supreme Court continues to alter injunctive relief jurisprudence affecting underlying rights at stake. Certain areas of law such as restitution and unjust enrichment are closely tied to equitable foundations, causing misperceptions of legal restitution and its implications on jury trial rights, defenses, and statutes of limitations. Finally, we explore whether purely legal remedies benefit from maintaining separate conceptions of equity versus borrowing equitable doctrines.

This discussion group focuses on the law surrounding anti-retaliation provisions across the labor and employment law field. In August 2016, the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission (EEOC) issued an "Enforcement Guidance on Retaliation and Related Issues." According to that guidance, the percentage of charges alleging retaliation has "essentially doubled since 1998" and retaliation is now the most "frequently alleged basis of discrimination in all sectors." This discussion group involves a broad exploration of several issues related to anti-retaliation provisions, including: what laws, procedures, and mechanisms can best work to eradicate retaliation; the requirement that opposition conduct must be based on a reasonable belief that the employer engaged in an unlawful employment practice; third-party retaliation; retaliatory hardssment; commentary on the new EEOC audance; and other timely topics.

Discussants address individual income tax, corporate income tax, state & local tax, estate & gift tax, tax expenditure policy, international tax and entitlements. While these disparate themes might seem only loosely related, a common thread of the difficulties of balancing equity, simplicity, incentives and transparency runs through all of them. These scholars will grapple with the central tax topics of the day and address the looming concerns that must be dealt with by all levels of government.
